Guideline:

- 1 Evaluators must be qualified as determined by the Oregon Health Authority Integrated Services and
- 2 Support Rules (OAR 309-032-1500 309-032-1565) to conduct both mental health and substance use
- 3 disorder assessments to determine the appropriate treatment recommendations.

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Qualified Substance Use Disorder Evaluators

- 6 1) Evaluators must be licensed, or otherwise authorized to practice, in the state they are providing the
- 7 assessment service and must have experience in the assessment and treatment of health care
- 8 professionals. They must have experience providing a level of care recommendation in accordance with
- 9 the American Society of Addiction Medicine Patient Placement Criteria.
- 2) Evaluators must be certified or licensed by a health or allied provider agency to provide alcohol and
- other drug treatment services that include assessment and treatment planning.
- 12 The certification must have included at least:
 - 750 hours of supervised experience in substance use counseling
 - 150 contact hours of education and training in substance use related subjects; and
 - Successful completion of a written objective examination

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- For evaluators holding a health or allied provider license, the license or registration must have been issued by one of the following state bodies and the person must possess documentation of at least 60 contact hours of academic or continuing professional education in alcohol or another drug treatment.
- 19 contact hours of academic or continuing professional education in alcohol or another drug treatment
 - Medical Board
 - Board of Psychologists Examiners
- Board of Licensed Social Workers
 - Board of Nursing
- Board of Licensed Professional Counselors

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Qualified Mental Health Professional Evaluators

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- 1) Evaluators must be licensed, or otherwise authorized to practice, in the state they are providing the
 assessment service and must have experience in the assessment and treatment of health care
 professionals.
- 2) Evaluators must be licensed by a health or allied provider agency to provide mental health treatmentservices that include assessment and treatment planning.

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3) Evaluators must hold a graduate or other advanced practice degree in psychology, social work, or other behavioral health field.

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For All Evaluators:

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Evaluators must demonstrate the ability to conduct an assessment, including identifying precipitating events, gathering histories of mental and physical health, alcohol and other drug use, past mental health services and criminal justice contacts, assessing family, cultural, social, and work relationships, conducting a mental status examination, and completing a DSM-5 diagnosis. There must also be a screening for suicidal and homicidal ideation and current or past trauma and abuse.

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Evaluators should be familiar with specialized health professional programs offered by treatment facilities in the state of Oregon, and preferably those around the country, that include multidisciplinary evaluations as well as psychiatric and/or substance use disorder treatment. The evaluator must be aware which programs are best for the specific diagnosis and be able to recommend two to three specific programs for each client whose assessment recommends further evaluation and/or treatment.

The packet must include CV or resume, copy of current license and state certifications, malpractice insurance and a sample assessment of a health care professional.

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Inclusion on the Health Professionals' Services Program board approved panel is solely at the HPSP Advisory Committee's discretion. There is no appeal process.

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
